The highest rates in reductions were measured among novice drivers (1st year to 4th year). In the United States auto accidents are the number one cause of death among a similar age group (ages 16 to 19) according to the Centers for Disease Control. According to Mr. Cole, "nothing like these schools exists in the United States as a result neither do the positive results that lead to measurable reductions in auto accidents due to training. In this case we are talking about saving lives, young lives." Mr. Cole goes on to say, "compared to the US laws governing motorists are more stringent in the countries that now lead the US in reduced accidents such as Austria, Luxembourg, Finland, Sweden, and Norway. However, these countries still experienced high accident rates due to driver error. These countries have proven that strict regulations alone will not suffice. Specialized training methods are required to reduce accidents. DRIVE RSTC, INC. is prepared to bring this revolutionary solution to the United States."
